



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Community Spay/ Neuter

Operations at the Spay & Neuter Clinic transitioned to a new veterinary provider in July 2016 upon Dr. Courtney's retirement. The new veterinary contractor team is now in place and responsible for daily operations at the Spay Neuter Clinic. The \$20 FIX program provides sterilization surgeries for pets of income-qualified families. This important program ensures affordable spay/neuter services are accessible to all of our citizens regardless of income.
