




Intake By Species/ Type Totals






2017 Placements:


2008-2017 Intake and Placement








Community Spay/ Neuter

Note: The Spay and Neuter Clinic was not operational during the first quarter of 2017 while a transition between veterinary contractors took place.


Sterilization Procedures Performed at the Spay & Neuter Clinic of Alamance County
