NOTICE OF DISCHARGE OF UNTREATED WASTE

BURLINGTON, NC— As required by the Clean Water Act of 1999 (House Bill 1160), the City of Burlington provides the following notice:

The City of Burlington had an overflow of approximately 2800 gallons of untreated wastewater from its sanitary collection system reach surface waters beginning at 1:00 PM on Friday, October 24, 2014 in the 2300 block of Morningside Drive in Burlington, NC. The overflow, caused by pipe failure, discharged 2800 gallons into an unnamed tributary of Service Creek. The flooding ceased at 7:30 PM on Friday, October 24, 2014.

The North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources, Division of Water Resources was notified of this overflow. This information is being published as required by the North Carolina General Statute, Article 21 Chapter 143.215.C.
