City of Burlington provides resources for businesses during COVID-19 Closures

BURLINGTON, NC— At 5pm on Wednesday, March 25, Executive Order NO. 120 goes into effect with a ban on gatherings of 50 or more people, restrictions on venues and long-term care facilities, an extension of school closure date to May 15, and closures of specific types of Businesses. Business closures include:

- Closed - gyms, health clubs, yoga studios, exercise facilities, etc.
- Closed - theaters, concert venues
- Closed - hair, beauty, nail salons & barber shop
- Closed - bowling alleys & skating rinks
- Closed - bingo, video game arcades, sweepstakes
- Closed - spas & massage parlors & tattoo parlors

The City of Burlington encourages our residents to take these orders seriously and use safety in their everyday activities. We need all residents to comply with these steps to ensure that we can “flatten the curve” so that there is adequate medical care and medical supplies for those in critical conditions.

The City of Burlington’s business owners and employees, like in all communities across the nation, are facing difficult times in the wake of COVID-19. Unemployment Insurance for Employees

Under Governor Cooper's Executive Order #118, individuals who, as a direct result of COVID-19, are separated from employment, have had their hours of employment reduced, or are prevented from working due to a medical condition caused by COVID-19 or due to communicable disease control measures may apply for unemployment assistance immediately.
