Link Transit will not operate on Monday January 17 due to forecasted ice storm

Burlington, NC — Link Transit, a transportation service connecting Burlington, Gibsonville, and Alamance Community College, will suspend operations on Monday 1/17 due to the forecast for significant ice accumulation on Sunday. Temperatures are not expected to be warm enough to begin service safely again on Monday 1/17. Service will resume on Tuesday 1/18 if conditions allow. An additional media release will be issued should further schedule modifications be required.

About Link Transit

Link Transit is Burlington's own bus system. Five fixed routes and a door-to-door demand response service for persons with disabilities is available in Burlington, Gibsonville and to Alamance Community College, Monday through Friday. All routes meet in Downtown Burlington at the transfer hub located at Worth and Webb Streets. Transit Services are funded with local, state and Federal funds and is operated under contract by Transdev Services, Inc of Lombard, Illinois.
