# Customer Service Relocates


## Establish Accounts, Pay Bills on Davis Street

On Monday, March 14, 2016, the City of Burlington's Customer Service/ Revenue Collections Division will officially relocate from the Municipal Building (425 S. Lexington Ave.) to the City's Annex Building (244 W. Davis St.).

The Annex building provides copious parking, ground level access, and full handicap accessibility. Two drive-through lanes will also be open for residents who would like the convenience of making payments from the comfort of their vehicle.

Customers must now visit the Annex Building to establish new water accounts or pay city bills such as water, tax, or fines. While these payments will no longer be accepted at the Municipal Building, they can be paid by automatic bank draft, online at [www.BurlingtonNC.gov/Payments](http://www.BurlingtonNC.gov/Payments) or placed in the after-hours drop box now located at 244 W. Davis St.

Not sure where to go? Check out the map below for directions from the Municipal Building to the Annex Building. It is best to enter via Maple Avenue.

### How does it work?

1. Place all bulk waste out one day prior to your normal trash pickup day.
2. No fees will be charged for bulk yard waste, bulk junk or bulk metals/white goods during this time period.

*Normally, bulk collection fees are \$6.75 per "bite" of the bulk trucks (bulkyard waste truck, bulk junk truck, bulk metal/white goods truck) unless only one bite per type of bulk is placed for pickup, in which case, there is no charge.*

### What CAN I put out?

#### Bulk Yard Waste

- ~ Tree trimmings 6 feet or less in length
- ~ Limbs 6 inches or less in width
- ~ Large yard waste volumes

*Note: Small yard waste items, properly placed/containerized loose leaves, pine needles, etc are always collected at no charge. All yard waste is taken to be recycled.*



#### Bulk Junk

- ~ Large household items
- ~ Mattresses
- ~ Sofas
- ~ Large furniture items
- ~ Rolled carpet



#### Bulk Metal/White Goods

- ~ Large appliances
- ~ White goods
- ~ Large metals

*Note: All metal/white goods are taken to be recycled*



### What CANT I put out?

#### Items NOT Collected

- ~ Used Oil and Filters, Anti-freeze, Lead Acid Batteries
- ~ Scrap Tires
- ~ Construction Debris and Wood Pallets
- ~ Oyster Shells
- ~ Florescent light tubes
- ~ Recyclables (collected separately by Waste Industries)
- ~ Electronics (e-waste, TV's, computers)
